

John is a retired Building Official with 35 years of experience in code enforcement. John retired in 2021 from the city of Frontenac, Missouri where he was the Building Commissioner and Zoning Administrator. John was also the Building Commissioner for Florissant, Missouri for 20 years. John has worked as an inspector, plan reviewer and building official for Florissant, Frontenac, Kirkwood, St. Peters and St. Charles County. Prior to being a code official John worked on three nuclear construction projects as an inspector, systems test engineer and quality assurance engineer, one of those projects was the Callaway Nuclear Plant in Missouri. He has performed thousands of inspections and plan reviews over the years. John holds numerous ICC certifications, including Master Code Professional and Certified Building Official. He has been involved in the code development process since the 1990s including serving three terms on the ICC Code Development General Building Code Committee, Code Interpretations Committee, Chairman of the St. Louis Area Code Review Committee and has attended code development hearings dating back to the legacy code organization, BOCA. John is a past President of MABOI and a Stoppleman Award recipient.

Jason LaChance, Sheet Metal Workers local 36 Instructor

Jason began his apprenticeship with the Sheet Metal Workers Local 36 in October of 1996 working on larger commercial and industrial jobsites. By 2008 he had been a foreman with several years under his belt and had decided to start working on becoming more acquainted with the testing and air balancing part of the industry. By 2015 he was TABB Certified through the ICB and by 2017 he had earned his TABB Supervisor Certification. In 2018 after achieving a number of certifications he decided to give back to his local by teaching night classes. After teaching layout, field measuring, and fire life safety classes at night, in January he became a fulltime day instructor at the Local 36 Training School, where he currently is teaching. Jason currently holds 11 certifications through the ICB including Fire and Smoke Damper Technician and Supervisor, Smoke Control Systems Technician and Supervisor, and Indoor Air Quality Technician and Supervisor.
